<p>2007 Act 80 implemented the recommendations of the Joint Legislative Council Study Committee on the Review of Crimes Against Children, chaired by Sen. Alberta Darling</p>	<p>2005 ACT 485 Treatment record confidentiality: release without written consent exception modified..... AB-33</p>
<p>2005 Act 5, “Amie’s Law”, gave law enforcement the ability to share information regarding juveniles on the sex offender registry when they believe it is necessary to protect the public</p>	<p>2005 ACT 486 Automatic defibrillator: civil liability immunity for users, owners, and providers of semiautomatic defibrillators expanded to include..... <p>2005 Act 125 strengthened and improved the Milwaukee school choice program to give qualified parents educational options for their children. In addition to increasing accountability and testing measures in the choice program, it provided for an increase in the Student Achievement Guarantee in Education (SAGE) program to reduce class sizes in eligible classrooms.</p>	<p>2001 ACT 93 Selective service registration: DOT notification requirements re information from driver's license, permit, or ID card applications..... <p>2005 Act 135 provided accountability in the room tax by requiring that revenue to be used for its intended purpose of promoting tourism promotion and development within the collecting municipality.</p>	<p>1999 ACT 126 Use of epinephrine auto-injectors on pupils by certain school employees and volunteers. <p>2005 Act 228 advanced efforts on health care price transparency to give consumers greater ability to make cost-effective, quality-conscious purchasing decisions on the plans that are best for them</p>	<p>1997 ACT 54 HIV test results: disclosure by attending physician revised..... AB-280</p>
<p>2005 Act 430, “Jessica’s Law”, increased penalties and made them mandatory for serious sexual assault crimes committed against children.</p>	<p>1997 ACT 74 Genetic test information from health care providers: insurers prohibited from requesting..... AB-157</p>
<p>2005 Act 431 provided for GPS-tracking of dangerous sex offenders out on probation, parole or supervised release</p>	<p>1997 ACT 206 Power of attorney for health care instrument: anatomical gift provisions..... AB-582</p>
<p>2005 Act 433, the “Internet Predator Law”, increased penalties for the use of a computer to facilitate child sex crimes and the distribution or possession of child pornography.</p>	<p>1997 ACT 226 Educational foundation sales and use tax exemptions created re public schools AB-494 , SB-490 (Darling #2 on bill)</p>
<p>2005 Act 455 increased the protection of parking privileges for persons with physical disabilities</p>	<p>1995 ACT 365 Female genital mutilation prohibited; exception provided..... AB-926</p>
<p>2005 Act 484 encouraged local government innovation and</p>	

efficiency by modifying local levy limits to allow for the continued operation of the consolidated North Shore Fire Department	
2003 Act 36 protected citizen's privacy and personal identification by expanding the coverage of the crime of identity theft	
2003 Act 120 addressed identity theft concerns by specifying to consumers that they need not disclose their social security numbers on certain financing statements	
2003 Act 187 provided tougher standards that sexually violent criminals are required to meet for release into supervised community placement	
2003 Act 192, written in response to concerns by the Villages of Bayside and Fox Point, made allowances for the operation of off-road utility vehicles under certain conditions	
2003 Act 193 allowed Milwaukee County the ability to enact an ordinance prohibiting the possession, manufacture and delivery of drug paraphernalia. 2005 Act 116 provided similar authority to municipal governments.	
2003 Act 279, supported by churches and religious leaders, protected children from abusive clergy by requiring clergy to be mandatory reporters of sexual abuse of children, gave victims of abuse a longer window of opportunity to file charges against offenders, and set forth a cause of action for sexual exploitation by a member of the clergy	
1999 Act 152 encouraged cost savings in the University of Wisconsin System by providing flexibility in grant funding for study abroad	
1997 Act 238 expanded Wisconsin's charter schools program to allow for more parental choice provide better educational opportunities for children.	
1997 Act 239 addressed the problem of school truancy by allowing school districts to attack the problem earlier, and created more options for schools and law enforcement in how they decide to respond to truancy problems.	
1997 Act 256 expanded the "Parents' Right to Know" provisions on the information that day care centers are required to share with	

parents and guardians	
1997 Act 294 provided juvenile courts with a new option for protecting children in abusive or neglectful settings	
1995 Act 55 modernized Wisconsin banking law and eliminated needless conflict between federal and state law.	
1995 Act 69 doubled prison time for those who commit certain sex crimes against children.	
1995 Act 265 prohibited any individual convicted of a sex crime against a child from volunteering to work with children. 2001 Act 97 expanded this prohibition to include those convicted of second degree sexual assault of a child.	
1995 Act 299 improved student reading skills by requiring instruction in the phonetic approach for every educator licensed to teach reading	
1995 Act 303 provided child welfare reform by transferring to the state the responsibility to meet the needs of abused and neglected children in Milwaukee County	
1995 Act 304 tripled the time period in which a person arrested in a domestic abuse incident must avoid contact with the alleged victim	
1995 Act 403 created the EdVest college tuition prepayment program to help families save for the costs of higher education. 1997 Act 158 strengthened the program, and 2003 Act 289 expanded EdVest to allow other relatives to make tax-deductible contributions to a student's account	
1995 Act 440, Wisconsin's Sexual Offender Registry and Community Notification Law, allowed families and law enforcement to know the whereabouts of sex offenders living in their communities.	
1995 Act 443 simplified adoption procedures for families choosing to adopt a child, and allowed flexibility in funding for the state's adoption information center	
1993 Act 479 is Wisconsin's landmark Sexual Predator Law, which allowed for the civil commitment of sexually violent persons to receive continued treatment in a secure facility rather than be released in the community.
